FUR, FABRIC & HAIR

1. Individually wrap your equipment in paper towels, or ship them in a mail-in kit or well-padded case. The teeth on clipper blades and the tips of scissors and knives are fragile.
2. Wrap clippers and dryers in multiple layers of paper or bubble wrap. For cordless clippers, please include the battery, dock, and cord in the box.
3. After everything is wrapped, pack it all into a box with sufficient packing material (packing peanuts or crumpled paper) to keep contents from moving around in the box. Close the box and shake it; if contents rattle, then you need more packing material.

4. If you would like to insure your package please do so. We are not responsible for lost or damaged packages in transit.

INDUSTRIAL & TRADES

1. Individually wrap your items in paper towels or heavy paper. The teeth on saw blades and chains are fragile and can chip if unprotected.
2. Place cardboard between saw blades. Secure chains with zip ties or twist ties so they cannot unwind. Cover sharp edges and points, so they cannot poke through the box.
3. After everything is wrapped, pack it all into a sturdy box with sufficient packing material (packing paper or crumpled newspaper) to prevent movement. Close the box and gently shake it; if contents shift or rattle, add more packing material.
